### **Superior & Supreme Stock Horse Versatility Awards**



These awards are based on the horse and rider's lifetime accomplishments within Stock Horse of Texas in the Non Pro and Open divisions. These awards are the highest achievement offered through SHTX.

Rider/horse combinations earn SHTX Merit Points based on All Around rankings at shows throughout the year. Once a horse/rider combination earns 100 SHTX Merit Points, they are presented the Superior Stock Horse Versatility Award. At 200 Merit Points, the Supreme Stock Horse Versatility Award is presented.

### Do You Own a Mustang?

The Mustang Heritage Foundation (MHF) has partnered with Stock Horse of Texas Association (SHTX) to offer special incentives for SHTX competitors showing Bureau of Land Management (BLM)-branded mustangs.



During the 2021 show season, MHF and SHTX will offer new high point mustang awards based on cumulative placings earned by qualifying horse and rider teams at SHTX shows throughout the year. First through third place high placing winners will receive prizes including a saddle, belt buckles, jackets, saddle pads, and more. All exhibitors who are members of both SHTX and MHF and compete with a BLM-branded mustang are eligible to earn these high point awards.

An additional benefit available to mustang exhibitors who are members of both SHTX and MHF will be a yearlong involvement incentive. All mustang exhibitors who compete in at least one class at a minimum of three SHTX shows will be entered in a random drawing to win \$1,500 in cash at the end of the show season.


### SHTX Back # Program

Do you have a lucky number? Want the same back number all year?

By donating to the SHTX Scholarship Fund and following these simple steps, you can have your back number for the year.

- 1. Choose an available back number (1-999). A list of purchased (unavailable) back #s will be on the SHTX Website under the Scholarships menu.
- 2. Mail a check payable to SHTX for \$100 per back number. Include information on what back # you want.
- 3. Every time you enter a show, put your back number in the upper right hand corner of Page 1 of the entry form. \*\*THIS IS IMPORTANT\*\* If you do not put your back number on each entry form, you will be assigned a random number for that show. The show secretaries can not keep up with specific back numbers, so it is the exhibitor's responsibility.
- 4. You will be given 2 copes of your chosen number. <u>You will need to keep up with that number for each show. SHTX does not have duplicates.</u>



Volunteers are the heart of our association, and we appreciate all they do to help us get things set up for a show.


New this year, SHTX is introducing the "Volunteer = Free Stuff" program (fancy name, huh?) Basically, if individuals volunteer for at least an hour at a show, they can earn credits for free shavings, t-shirts, caps or even stalls and entries.

1 Hour = \$10 credit (you can bank your credits if you like)

The shows we can use volunteers include: Bryan (March), San Antonio, Belton, Amarillo, Sweetwater & the World Show

Most volunteer jobs occur Thursday afternoon and evening, and Saturday/Sunday after the show is complete. We need help with things like hanging banners, unloading trail, sometimes working gates and a few other odd jobs.

# Did you know that SHTX has a Media Policy?

To protect our members, our events and our horses, the SHTX Board adopted a media policy.

### **Key Points:**

- Horse owners & family members can shoot cell phone video and cell phone photos of their own horses at all shows.
- Anyone using professional camera equipment (lens 4" or longer, tripod, etc) must sign a Media Agreement in the show office before taking any photographs. Rules allowing professional camera equipment vary depending on the show.

### HISTORICAL CORNER WITH JIM TRUEMPER

Way back in the Seventies when advertising cigarettes was legal, there was an ad campaign of one brand that targeted women smokers. The ad slogan was: "You've come a long way, baby."

When I entered the banquet room last March and saw the impressive array of awards to be distributed that evening, this slogan popped into my head. Indeed SHTX has come a long way. The nine saddles which lined the stage were particularly eye catching. My thoughts drifted back to Abilene in March, 2002, at the awards dinner where two saddles were awarded for the first time. Referring to the evening as a banquet would probably be an overstatement. About 40 or 50 folks were in attendance in the back room of one of the buildings on vendors' row at the Taylor County Expo Center. Dr. Dennis Sigler, the Vice-President, drafted his son, Mark, along with Stewart Bozeman and several other ACU students to prepare the meal. They cooked steaks in the parking lot outside the back door of the "banquet hall." The boys did an excellent job and worked very cheap. I recall the saddles were built by Art's Saddle Shop in Denison.

President B.F. Yeates presented the Open All-Around saddle to Kim Lindsey. A lesson to be remembered is that B.F. and Kim were tied for the All-Around at the end of the year. As now, the cow work was the tie breaker and Kim won. The Novice All-Around saddle was won by John Chevrette of Austin. Kim had ridden the first of several bay geldings she showed in SHTX events. The horse was named Valentino Pauli who was sired by Pauli Olena, bred

and owned by Jack Brainard, member #1 and the primary founder of SHTX. I believe a horse from Jack's breeding program winning the first saddle very fitting. Jack will celebrate his 100th birthday in 2021!

Over the years the awards in-




creased. In the future the slogan may read, "SHTX has come a longer way, baby!" For many years I have stored splint boots in a tote bag which was a top ten award in 2003. I had to replace the straps which wore out from years of bouncing down the road in the trailer. Top Ten vests were awarded in 2005; I missed out, but I still wear the vest Freckles and I won in 2006.

I hate to end on a sad note, but I must report the death of Don Becker, 62, last year. Don was a member of the Plano Fire Department and lost a battle with cancer. In mid-May 1998 he was elected and served as the first Vice-President of the Stock Horse of Texas Association. He was also a member of the original Stock Horse of Texas Leadership Team which was responsible for putting Jack's ideas for the all-around horse into practice.

We miss all of you and know that this Covid-19 situation won't last forever. Be well and be safe.
