





All Stall and RV reservations are ONLINE.

Bring a separate check to pay for stalls & RV. When you arrive, go to the stall table to pay and your stalls/RV will be unlocked at that time.


A Stall Map and RV Map are available on the SHTX Website to help you choose your exact location.



- 1. Click on the Booking Link (on the SHTX website)
- 2. Click either West Stall Barn, East Stall Barn or RV
- 3. Scroll and sign up on stall/RV number you would like by clicking the beside that number.
- 4. Tell us which nights (Sat, Fri-Sun, etc)
- 5. On the stall reservations, choose the # of shavings for that stall. That # of unopened bags of shavings will be in your stall on arrival.

Additional shavings will be available on arrival.

We lost a tough, brave cowgirl when Darlene Isbell Hicks of Hawley, Texas, died on July 10, 2011. She never rode a horse until after she married Thomas Hicks, but she soon loved to ride and show horses. She learned to team rope with her husband and also enjoyed wagon driving. Darlene was a member of Stock Horse of Texas Association, Texas Draft Horse Association and American Stock Horse Association. She was diagnosed with colon cancer in 2000. While fighting cancer, she showed in Stock Horse of Texas competitions on several different horses. She won buckles, bronzes, a saddle and she was SHTX



Reserve Champion Limited Non-Pro for 2010. One saying that gave Darlene encouragement during her battle was, "courage is being scared to death - but saddling up anyway."

In her honor, the Darlene Hicks Scholarship fund was established. This scholarship is awarded to a graduating high school senior. Applications are due February 1, and can be found on the SHTX website in the Scholarships section.



Historical Corner: Remembering Dr. Wilson

There are two new events on the 2020 schedule which would not have been possible without the vision and effort of the late Dr. Kris Wilson, who pioneered collegiate stock horse competitions. The first is the Road to the Horse Collegiate Colt Starting Challenge to be held February 5th and 6th during the Fort Worth Stock Show. Teams from Texas Tech University, West Texas A&M University and North Central Texas College earned their spots in this unique competition at the Western Horseman Stock Horse of Texas World Show. The second new event is the National Ranch and Stock Horse Alliance National Championship Show scheduled for March 29th and 30th at the Texas Tech University Equestrian Center. The cow horse classes will very fittingly be held in the Kris Wilson Fearless Champion Arena. If you are a contestant or spectator at either of these events, remember Dr. Wilson because he will certainly be watching. The following article appeared in the December 2010 issue of Western Horseman and is reproduced with permission of Western Horseman.

New Boss on the Bell

Kris Wilson joined the Silver Spur's Bell Ranch division in September.

HORTLY AFTER THE BELL was purchased by Silver Spur Ranches earlier this year, the new ownership hired a manager to direct the legendary New Mexico ranch. Kris Wilson, a 32-year-old West Texas cowboy who lived in New Mexico as a boy, eagerly accepted the new position.

"It's a dream come true for me," Wilson says. "This is going to be a big job, but I'm excited about it. My dad worked out here on the wagon in the '60s. He was 17 and helped the Bell and the Spades with their spring brandings."

Wilson, his wife, and their newborn son moved from the Matador Ranch to the Bell in September. The 300,000-acre ranch offers excellent climate and grazing for both cattle and horses. Silver Spur plans to move its broodmare band and three stallions from its headquarters ranch in southern Wyoming to the Bell division. Silver Spur's stallions are sired by WR This Cats Smart, Lean With Me and Two Eyed Red Buck. The ranch's goal is to raise athletic, cow-smart horses with enough size to handle traditional ranch work.

"The Bell is big country, so you need to have a stout horse with good feet and legs," Wilson says. "But we'd also like them to

have some look and some cow sense. We plan on showing them some."

Wilson brings experience in training and showing, particularly in ranch versatility events. In 2009, he showed Judys Ten to championships at both the American Stock Horse Association Futurity and the Caprock Ranchers Futurity. He is also the outgoing president of the Stock Horse of Texas Association.

Before working for the Matador Ranch, Wilson served as an equine science professor and ranch versatility team coach at Texas Tech University. He earned a Ph.D. in animal science from Texas Tech after receiving graduate and undergraduate degrees at Texas A&M University.

By moving to the Bell Ranch division, Wilson joins the ninth largest commercial cattle operation in the United States. Silver Spur, based in Encampment, Wyoming, runs more than 13,000 cows on ranches in Wyoming, Colorado and New Mexico.

Silver Spur plans to cross Red Angus bulls on the Bell's existing cow herd, which includes cattle carrying Red Bell bloodlines.

"The Bell Ranch has been a real traditional operation," Wilson adds. "The new owners don't want to change that, but they want to be progressive with genetics."
