GEARING UP FOR BRYAN, WORLD SHOW

What an exciting year for Stock Horse of Texas! It seems like just a few days ago we were kicking off the new year, and now we are in the downhill stretch. Bryan is shaping up to be a great show, and the year end point race is in full swing. Don't forget -- the SHTX Rulebook states you must attend at least 50% of the shows in a year to qualify for year end awards. This year, SHTX will have a total of 10 shows that count toward year end points, so a rider must compete in 5 shows to receive awards (remember, the Dripping Springs show was not a point show but will count toward Constant Competitor jackets).

The Western Horseman Stock Horse World Show is two complete shows that each count toward year end awards. In the days after the world show, we will tabulate the year end points, taking each rider's best 8 shows. So if you attended more than 8, we will drop your lower point-earning shows. It looks like a tight race in several divisions! Don't forget -- we also award Constant Competitor jackets to each exhibitor showing in the all around of a division for at least 8 shows.

The Western Horseman Stock Horse World Show is just around the corner. Entry forms are online, as well as paid cow work sign up sheets. There is an FAQ on the website that answers a lot of questions regarding paid practices. Please take a few minutes and go over the rules so that everyone is on the same page when it comes to paid practices. We have been working on the prize line up for this show, and we are excited to award \$70,000 in buckles, bronzes, tack, vests and more! It will be an exciting weekend!


- Stalls \$30 (Grounds Fee \$15 if no stall)

Information on World Show Paid Warm Ups

Hours

- Thursday 2-7pm > Cow & Trail
- Thursday 4-7 > Reining
- Friday > Cow & Trail only for 2 hours immediately following the show on Friday evening

Arenas (excluding trail) will be open for general riding at all times (other than during paid practices) unless the ground is being prepared for the show.

• Cow Paid Practice: \$50 for 3-1/2 minutes. Must be reserved online (see website for links). If you reserve a Cow Paid Practice online, please mark "cow paid practice" on your entry form so that it can be included on your invoice. No cow paid practices will be available to sign up at the show. If no slots are available on the Online Sign Up, then the session is SOLD OUT. A rider/horse combo is only allowed

one cow practice so that there is room for all who are interested. Please only sign up for one spot.

> >> Please Do Not Miss Your Chosen Time. If you miss your time, you forfeit your money and practice spot. If you need to change times, find someone to swap with.



- Trail Cash at the Gate \$25 per course for 10 minutes (there will be 2 trail courses). Up to 4 horses at a time on the course. No horses will be allowed in the trail arenas without paying the paid practice fee. Trail arenas will be locked at all other times.
- Reining Cash at the Gate \$25 for 5 minutes alone in the main reining arena. The overflow reining arena (Horse Barn) is open anytime to all riders. Reining practice is available only on Thursday.
 - >> You may sign up for a time with the person working the gate at Trail and Reining. If you miss your time, you forfeit your practice

spot and money. If you need to change times, find someone to swap with. If you have multiple paid practices on the same day, be sure to schedule your time slots with a break in between. Please do not schedule two arenas back to back.

>> Paid Practices WILL CLOSE promptly at 7pm on Thursday & will only be open for 2 hours on Friday. Please do not show up near the end and expect to ride.

>> Trail Courses will be available to walk (on foot only) 30 minutes prior to the start of the show each morning.

TIME MANAGEMENT ON PAID PRACTICES IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY.

PLEASE BE AWARE OF THE TIME SLOTS YOU ARE CHOOSING IN COW AND TRAIL TO MAKE SURE YOU CAN MAKE BOTH TIMES.



HISTORICAL CORNER WITH JIM TRUEMPER - SAFETY AWARE

Dr. Larry Lane, our village horse doctor, says if you put a horse in a padded stall, the horse will figure out a way to get hurt. I'm sure we all have found this to be an accurate statement. One of our jobs as horse owners is to minimize these accidents. Here are some of the more unusual horse misadventures.

First we have the 'Flat Back Bucket Handle Trap'. At the Texas Tech SHTX show this year, after completing three events, I had a break of several hours before reining. I tied Josey in the stall making sure she had access to hay and water, loosened the cinch, and went to lunch. We have all done this hundreds of times. A while later Kim Lindsey called to tell me my horse was hurt in the stall. She had apparently stuck her head in a full bucket of water with her nostrils closed and caught the halter in the 'j' of the handle. Trapped and sensing she was about to drown, the wreck was on. Fortunately, Kim and Michelle Reding were a short distance away and hearing the commotion came to her aid. She had several minor cuts, pulled a shoe, and broke the breast collar, but she did not drown, thanks to my friends. Kim asked why I didn't have the handle hooks wrapped. I had



never heard of anyone having this problem. At Belton, when Renate Finley, a member of our very able cow crew, was setting up her stall, I noticed the handle hooks of her buckets were wrapped with tape. She once worked at a vet clinic and said horses had been brought in with torn nostrils and ripped lips from getting caught in bucket handles. When I got home from Lubbock, I wrapped the handles of every water bucket we own using Wrap-Fix by Duck Brands (at Walmart) and finishing the top of the wrap with electrical tape.

Benjamin Franklin said, "Beer is proof that God loves us and wants us to be happy." Wasps are proof that while God loves us, sometimes God may not like us! Just ask Cathy Clements. Three


years ago she loaded their gelding Opie (Seven S Limelight) into their trailer and drove a short distance when a ruckus a bit less than World War III began. Wasps had nested in a roof vent and attacked poor Opie. In panic

and pain, he fought to get out of the trailer. The horse and the trailer suffered extensive damage. While the trailer was easily repairable, Opie's recovery took a little more than a year. Check your roof vents every time before you load in the warmer months. I spray my roof vents about once a month with wasp and hornet spray or Raid Bug Barrier. This encourages these painful critters to homestead elsewhere.


Another issue seen at many shows and clinics is the hanging halter. People leave a halter hanging while putting a bridle on their horse and then ride away. It's a perfect "hoop" for other riders to hang a foot in as they ride by or for a jumpy horse to catch a leg in. Please either hang your halters on the top rail or remove them completely from a fence.

Lastly, we have the 'Flank Cinch Fubar' (fouled up beyond all recognition). I am seeing less of this problem at shows than in the past. That issue is enough daylight between the flank cinch and the horse's belly to stick your hat through. The wreck which occurs when a horse catches a foot kicking at a fly benefits only veterinarians and saddle repair shops! The Summer 2018 issue of the Ranch Horse Journal features an excellent article by Gatlin Duncan on flank cinches on page 58.
